Customers are always delighted to see the dazzling selection of trees, wreaths, boughs and decorative plants starting on **November 9 at Jean-Talon Market**, **November 10 at Atwater Market and November 18 at Maisonneuve Market**. Once again this year, the **Marché de Quartier Jean Brillant** has had gorgeous trees since **November 12**, while the **Marché de Quartier Mont Royal** began tree sales on **November 20**. Whether you prefer balsam or Fraser fir, a wildling tree or a hybrid, every option can be found in Montreal's public markets. It's a great way to beautify your home while supporting local producers who have been part of Montrealers' lives for generations.

In this market-wide scavenger hunt, participants will have to solve nine tricky puzzles in order to find all the reindeer. To spread some holiday cheer, each week's participants will have the chance to win a \$100 Marchés publics de Montréal gift certificate.

Three thoroughly festive weekends at Jean-Talon Market

On three weekends in December (9-10, 16-17 and 23), Jean-Talon Market will present highly entertaining indoor and outdoor Holiday programming. The family-friendly activities include Holiday-themed workshops, chances to meet Santa Claus, singers, caroling and free samples of hot chocolate.

On **Saturday, December 9** from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., singer Manu Reymond will interpret the great Holiday classics in the market's outdoor areas. Then, from 1 to 3 p.m., the Aux quatre vents quartet of the Orchestre d'harmonie Leonardo Da Vinci will fill Jean-Talon Market with Christmas music; visitors are invited to head up to the mezzanine to watch the performance. On **Sunday, December 10** from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., the mobile art duo of 2 Parquatte will entertain visitors of all ages in the market's outdoor areas; a Bazar Production production. Finally, from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m., the Chœur en commun choir will bring still more seasonal cheer to the market's outdoor areas with a selection of Christmas carols.

On **Saturday, December 16** from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., Manu Raymond returns to sing for Jean-Talon Market visitors, this time indoors. From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., children will get the chance to give Santa their Christmas wish-list, in the market's outdoor space. To add some extra magic to a special moment, they will be able to enjoy some free hot chocolate. Also outdoors, from 1 to 2:40 p.m., the Chœur de la Petite Patrie will delight everyone with its Christmas carols. Inside, on the mezzanine from 1 to 2:30, Jean-Talon Market presents three culinary workshops for kids hosted by C'est moi le chef! **Sunday, December 17** from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., creative types are invited to craft Christmas decorations on the mezzanine. Outside from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., classic Christmas songs will fill the air thanks to Chœur de Maisonneuve, while singer Manu Reymond will keep the festivities going from 1 to 3 p.m.

Finally, on **Saturday, December 23** from 1 to 3 p.m., Manu Reymond will return for a final time to entertain market shoppers.

These activities, including the scavenger hunt, are made possible by the support of the Ville de Montréal, the Arrondissement Rosemont–La Petite-Patrie and SDC Petite-Italie - Marché Jean-Talon.

Fête des lutins: Santa's elves at Maisonneuve market

On **December 10** from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. the Fête des lutins returns for a second year to Maisonneuve Market, steeped in holiday magic. From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., neighbourhood children can meet Santa Claus outside the market and make some wonderful memories. Parents and children will also be offered free hot chocolate. From 2 to 4 p.m., a singer will provide Holiday ambiance with a selection of Christmas classics. Families are also invited to visit the market's merchants to do their holiday shopping and take advantage of some great specials.

Atwater Market Christmas Village

Once again this year, the Christmas Village returns to Atwater Market for the 8th consecutive year. It will be open every weekend from November 30 to December 31. Some 60 local artisans will set up shop during the month, offering prepared food, beverages, clothing, cosmetics and all kinds of gifts. Five food vendors will help visitors satisfy their cravings and warm up with a hot drink. As in past years, the Christmas Village will also present a free program of entertainment for all. Singers, choirs, DJs, musicians, Santa Claus and gourmet evenings are all on the agenda. Open Fridays from 5 to 9 p.m., Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Sundays from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.
