Montreal, April 30, 2025 – Montreal's public markets officially switch to summer mode this Saturday, May 3! Starting this weekend, visitors will enjoy the full-size versions of Atwater, Jean-Talon and Maisonneuve markets, along with the Neighbourhood and Solidarity markets. They'll find local flowers, fruits and vegetables, savour the markets' many prepared food options and discover some delicious new arrivals. The warm season is also the time to participate in a variety of events and workshops for every age and taste.

Eating local made easier, thanks to our public markets

With the arrival of beautiful spring days, farmers return to their outdoor stalls at Montreal's public markets, in anticipation of a full season of bountiful new crops. Fiddleheads and asparagus launch the growing season, followed by a tantalizing parade of colours and flavours – blueberries, raspberries, corn, cucumbers, strawberries, tomatoes, eggplants and much more. Eating local has never tasted better! This year is also the fifth edition of the Kiosques de la Relève, an initiative that allows agri-food startups to introduce their products to Montrealers.

Meanwhile, **Maisonneuve Market** turns Saturdays into musical gourmet gatherings with the return of its <u>lively outdoor zone</u>. Every Saturday from May 3 to October 20, this iconic market in the city's east end features fun gatherings of farmers, restaurateurs and culinary artisans, accompanied by great music.

A city of flowers, thanks to Montreal's public markets

Starting May 3, the public markets will also welcome horticulturists and their countless flowers and seedlings. Their overflowing stalls are a wonderful testament to Montrealers' passion for beautifying their surroundings. All summer, merchants will be delighted to guide visitors through their extensive offerings. Their expert advice will allow everyone to find the right plants to transform their balcony, patio and garden.

New taste sensations at the Atwater and Jean-Talon markets

Atwater and Jean-Talon markets will once again feature delicious ready-to-eat fare, including several new permanent restaurants and the opening of their seasonal restaurant zones and terrasses.

- Atwater Market welcomes two new businesses: Aylwin Deli, which will delight visitors starting in June with iconic Montreal smoked meat sandwiches and a selection of dishes to go, and Atelier Cookie par Caro with decadent homemade cookies. Under the big tent of the Pôle des Saveurs, visitors will find a delicious and diverse set of options served up by Ave Greene, Aylwin Barbecue, Ca Lem, Falafel Yoni, Layla's, Le Petit Sao, Léché Desserts, Margot Bar à Jus, Satay Brothers and Sushi Shop.
- Jean-Talon Market features three new gourmet concepts including 3 Pierres 1 Feu restaurant by renowned chef Paul Toussaint. The restaurant will serve Caribbean fusion cuisine with a Montreal and Texas barbecue twist. Les Filles Fattoush are opening their first permanent storefront in June, serving a selection of hot mezze and Middle Eastern products. Finally, the well-established fishmonger Les Délices de la Mer is opening a small restaurant with seafood dishes to eat in or take home. The restaurant zone will be busy with the return of ten establishments: Bouffe-moi! CASA Poutine, Mangue et Melon, Mazorca MTL, La boîte aux Huîtres, La Crêperie du Marché, Les Filles Fattoush (whose stall will now serve Syrian street food), Loumi, Panda Restaurant and Roxy Focaccia.

Its membership includes nearly 200 merchants active at the public markets. The Société's network of public markets is frequented by more than three quarters of Montrealers, with more than 3 million visits annually.
